Therefore your child should feel both proud and honored to be a part of a BSA Celtic team and our club tradition.

The following information has been put together to provide an overview of the expectations of each family with regards to volunteer commitment and fees. Your personal involvement is crucial to the success of the program. Upon final selection of teams, each team will have a parent meeting to discuss time commitment, review areas of additional expenses and answer any questions you may have.

The BSA Celtic Soccer Club is a non-profit, volunteer driven organization that has been a positive influence in the lives of many Dayton area children and their parents since 1982. We are proud of the organization and its contributions to the community and we trust your association with the Celtic Soccer Club will be rewarding.

BSA Celtic Mission Statement

To provide a safe, fun and educational environment for the development of soccer skills, leadership, and team cooperation; to foster good sportsmanship, moral and ethical values, and to help prepare all participants for the next level of competition; and to provide an atmosphere to develop our children and their coaches in pursuit of competitive, quality soccer play.

VOLUNTEER COMMITMENT

The BSA Celtic Soccer Club is a volunteer driven, non-profit organization. Parent/family participation and involvement is critical to the success of the club. Each parent/family is expected to volunteer during the course of the year.

- Team: Everyone should have a part in your team. There are plenty of opportunities to help out with your child's team. Most of the coaches are volunteers and therefore should focus on coaching. There will also need to be a team treasurer, uniform coordinator, team representative, team administrator, and team volunteer coordinator.
- Fall/Spring Field Cleanup: This is for yard work, painting and general complex maintenance. Each player's family will be expected to work one morning either in the fall or in the spring, on the designated day. You are the ones who help keep our complex beautiful.
- Haunted Classic Tournament: The Haunted Classic will be held October 23/24, 2010. This will be the second edition of this tournament and it will be directed by the BSA Celtic Club. This tournament differs from the Creek Classic in that the tournament is being sponsored by the BSA Celtic Club rather than the entire BSA organization. **The entry fee is waived provided the player's family works their required volunteer hours (no more than 4 hours per player) during the tournament weekend.** Funds from this tournament are used to support club expenses.
- Creek Classic Tournament: The Creek Classic will be held late May or early June 2011. This tournament benefits the entire BSA organization. **Entry fee for this tournament is also waived provided volunteer hours are met. Each player's family is required to work 4 hours during the tournament weekend.** The Team Volunteer Coordinator will assign the times and duties for your team. Funds from this tournament support the entire BSA program and the Ankeney Soccer Complex.

FEES

The financial requirement for the 2010-2011 full year season for U8-U14 players.

- **BSA Celtic Player Fee:** U8 and U9 - \$350 per year; U10 and above - \$420 per year.

Fee includes: 1 training session per week with a professional trainer(s); goalkeeper training; league and referee fees; BSA player fee for field maintenance; phone tree; equipment; two tournaments (Creek Classic and Haunted Classic provided volunteer hours are met); and more. There is a \$25 discount for each additional sibling. This fee covers both the fall and spring seasons and can be paid in two installments.

In addition, some top teams in the older age groups (typically U11 to U14) may have paid professional coaches. This is an additional expense on an individual team basis which will be discussed at tryouts. This per player fee will be \$125 per player per year.

First Installment Payment Due July 30th

- **Uniforms:** Approximate cost of an entire uniform kit is \$100 to \$115. Uniform kits consist of Home/Away jerseys, shorts, 2 pairs of socks and a 'training' t-shirt. The Club typically keeps a uniform kit in cycle for 3 years and you would only need to replace worn out items in between cycles. Warm-ups and backpacks are available for order as well. Club spirit wear can be also ordered separately. Purchase of these items is done through the Celtic on-line system.

Payment Due with order

- **Tournaments:** The Club fees include two tournaments: the Haunted Classic in the fall and the Creek Classic in the spring. Additional tournaments will be at an additional expense that will vary by team. Your coach will discuss this at the parent meeting. The average cost per tournament is about \$40-\$45/player. Please recognize that these fees will be collected and paid by the team prior to registration for each tournament. By committing to the team, each player is expected to pay and play in these tournaments. We encourage all of our teams to participate in tournaments throughout the season. Each coach is given guidelines and direction on the number and level of tournaments to play based on each teams ability and age.

Payment Due as needed

- **Winter Training, Futsal, and Indoor leagues:** These are not mandatory for the BSA Celtic program but are encouraged. Cost and involvement will vary by team and should be discussed at the parent meeting with the coach. In the past, the club has been able to help offset some of these fees.
